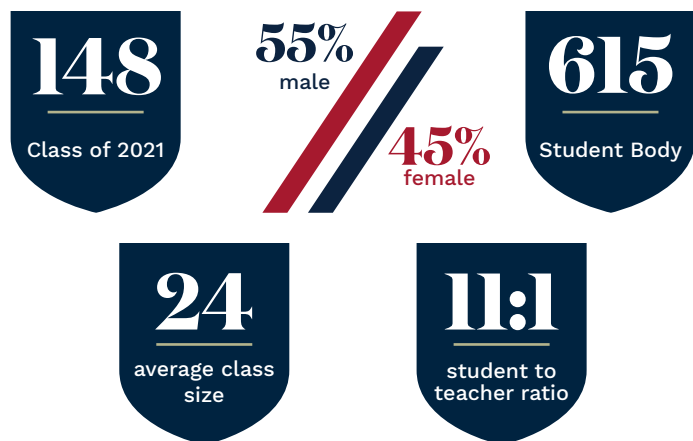
OUR STORY AND LASALLIAN TRADITION

2021-2022 LANCER HIGHLIGHTS

La Salle's **Speech and Debate** team had a successful year of Zoom competition with lots of promise in the younger members of the team. A student advanced at the California State level and 2 students advanced at the National level.

Competing on a virtual stage, the Lancer **Academic Decathlon** team earned over 100 medals at the Southern California Private School academic decathlon and took home two division titles. Overall, the top team finished third of all private schools that competed. While there was no World Scholars Cup this year, La Salle has sent teams to compete in Cape Town, Melbourne, and the Hague in recent years.

CURRICULUM / GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Over 85 UC Certified/Approved courses offered
- Students are required to take 7 courses per year.
- Traditional A-F grading system with plus/minus. There is no A+ grade.
- GPAs are cumulative from grades 9-12 and weighted on a 4.0 scale.
- 220 units in core subjects + 55 elective units required
- 24 AP and 13 Honors courses (80% AP Exam pass rate) with weighted GPA.
- Honors and AP courses are weighted with one extra point when calculating GPA.

Once COVID-19 protocols relaxed, **Lancer Athletics** came out in full force, taking home 8 league titles, 4 MVP titles, 23 1st Team All-League titles and 17 2nd Team All-League titles. Of the 23 offered Athletic programs, 5 did not compete in the CIF season. Of the remaining 18 programs, 16 advanced to playoffs.

Girls' Tennis earned both League and CIF titles, a first for the program in school history. Track secured 2 Division 4 CIF champion titles.

La Salle graduated 11 senior athletes with a commitment to play at the collegiate level.
