Student Life at La Salle College Preparatory provides everyone the opportunity to grow in faith, engage in service, and take an active role in the community life of the school.

Student Life merges the organizations of Associated Student Body with Campus Ministry. It seeks to live the mission of the school by nurturing the talents of each student through leadership roles such as student life officers, class representatives, retreat leaders, liturgical ministers and more.

Students gain a sense of responsibility for others by organizing inclusive activities such as retreats, on-campus service projects and team-building experiences. Students are challenged to embrace diversity through the various programs, clubs and organizations on campus.

Finally, we serve the poor and marginalized through organized opportunities including Union Station, Adopt-A-Family, Catholic Schools Week. Student Life organizes longer service immersion trips where students (and faculty) engage in service-learning focused on social justice topics.

Students do not “join” Student Life. Instead, all students are invited to live out the Lasallian spirit through student life from the moment they become members of our community.

A Few Things We Do

Faith Opportunities: We seek to nourish the spiritual growth of each student while building community through dynamic programs of liturgies and retreats.

How We Serve Our Community: Faculty, staff and students perform over 4500 hours of combined volunteer work at local non-profit organizations during Catholic Schools Week. A La Salle graduate will have participated in over 75 hours of service through Christian service opportunities. Some of the service sites we partner with include LA Food Bank, Union Station, Project Angel Food, Ability First, Hillside Home for Children, Huntington Memorial Hospital, Kensington Assisted Senior Living Center, and local schools in the San Gabriel Valley.

Service Immersion Trips: Students have the opportunity to participate in the annual Lasallian Youth Assembly, a week-long service experience with other Lasallian Schools. A limited number of students participate in El Otro Lado, a week-long service-learning experience focusing on the topic of immigration in Tucson, AZ.

Fun and Exciting Events: Students plan, implement and evaluate spirit-filled events that center around our athletic teams, academic competition boards, and visual and performing artists. Ask about our **SHOWDOWN** event!

A Welcoming Environment: Student-organized events including orientations, dances, and lunchtime activities at the beginning of the year that introduce our first-year and transfer students to the School and the Lasallian Mission.
