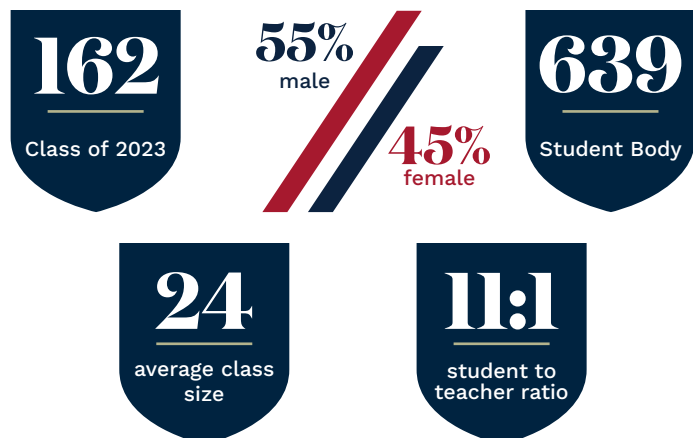
OUR STORY AND LASALLIAN TRADITION

2022-2023 LANCER HIGHLIGHTS

La Salle's **Speech and Debate** team had a successful year of competition with lots of promise in the younger members of the team. A student advanced at the California State level and 2 students advanced at the National level.

The Lancer **Academic Decathlon** team earned over 100 medals at the Southern California Private School academic decathlon and took home two division titles. Overall, the top team finished third of all private schools that competed. This year, La Salle sent 9 students to compete at the Global Round of the World Scholar's Cup in Prague. Each of the three teams placed in the Top 10, earning them all a spot at the Tournament of Champions at Yale

CURRICULUM / GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Over 85 UC Certified/Approved courses offered
- Students are required to take 7 courses per year.
- Traditional A-F grading system with plus/minus. There is no A+ grade.
- GPAs are cumulative from grades 9-12 and weighted on a 4.0 scale.
- 220 units in core subjects + 55 elective units required
- 24 AP and 13 Honors courses (80% AP Exam pass rate) with weighted GPA.
- Honors and AP courses are weighted with one extra point when calculating GPA.

in November. One student scored the highest overall and ended up placing first in the entire competition.

Lancer Athletics came out in full force, taking home six league titles, one co-league championship title, nine MVP titles, 39 1st Team All-League titles and 30 2nd Team All-League titles. Of the 23 offered Athletic programs, 15 advanced to playoffs.

An historic first for La Salle, the Girls' Basketball advanced all the way to the CIF-SS Division 3 State Championship in Sacramento, California.

La Salle graduated eight senior athletes with a commitment to play at the collegiate level.
